The ESF is Europe's **main tool for promoting employment and social inclusion** – helping people get a job (or a better job), integrating disadvantaged people into society and ensuring fairer life opportunities for all.

It does this by **investing in Europe's people and their skills** – employed and jobless, young and old.

In2014-20, the ESF will provide some **€80 billion** (*in current prices*) in funding to:

- train people and help them get into work
- promote <u>social inclusion</u>
- improve <u>education & training</u>
- improve the quality of <u>public services</u> in your country.

HOW IT HAS BEEN FINANCED THE EUROPEAN SOCIAL FOUND

Its 7-year **operational programmes** are planned by governments and approved by the European Commission.

Funding is given to a **wide range of organisations** – public bodies, private companies and civil society – which give people **practical help** to find a job, or stay in their job.

Regione Liguria in October 2013 issued an invitation to tender to use this capital and "Regional project for European port community" won the bid.



WHO ARE THE ACTORS?

Regional project for European port communty is being supported by a partnership comprising **three training schools**, **Assagenti** (the Genoese shipbrokers and ship agents association) and **Spediporto**, the Genoese freight forwarder association.





How the project has been planned

The project resulted from a **detailed analysis** of the shipping sector and its **training needs**.

It is delivered at regional level at the ports in Liguria through four different courses across varying training levels.





THE COURSES

High level training: Expert in transport, logistics and shipping

Duration: 1,500 hours, from July 2014 to June 2015 Students: 20 university graduates Realized by Asfor

• Middle-High level training: Broker


Duration: 400 hours, from September 2014 Students: 12 high school graduates Realized by Fondazione Accademia della Marina Mercantile

• Middle level training: Forwarder

Duration: 600 hours, from October 2014 Students: 15 high school graduates Realized by Scuola Nazionale Trasporti in La Spezia

• Trade level training: Warehouseman

Duration: 600 hours from October 2014 Students: 18, with three years qualification Realized by CFP



HIGH LEVEL TRAINING EXPERT IN TRASPORT, LOGISTICS AND SHIPPING

The skills learned in the course will allow the participants to gain **detailed knowledge of supply chain and technological processes** allowing them to operate even more effectively in the commercial, operative and administration divisions of shipping and forwarding companies or local or international logistics operators.



How might ecasba be involved?



This course aims to provide training at a very high level and it finishes with a work experience abroad in a shipping or forwarding company at a major European port.


We are still looking for foreing companies which could be interested in hosting students for two months during the spring time.

Ecasba could promote such initiative as its aim is to encourage sharing of ideas, activities and purposes. How are the economic efforts of the companies involved in hosting students?

The training school is going to take care about all the **bureaucratic obligations** (job insurance, forms, etc.) and **pay board, lodging and travel expenses** for the students involved.

The company is not obliged to pay **any salary**, cause all the expences (board, lodging and travel) are already financed and granted by the school.
